CANADA WITH BRITAIN

Increases and Decreases in Imports and Exports for January.

London, Feb. 8.—The British Board of Trade returns for January show the following increases in imports from Canada: Wheat, 110,000; white flour, 47,000; bacon, 440,000; corn, 237,000; oats, 130,000; cattle, 128,000; sheep and lambs, 4,000; hams, 115,000; eggs, 4,000; sawn wood, 47,000.
