Butter and Eggs-Butter is in good demand, and the supply is on the increase; prices are steady, at 23c to 24c for crocks and 24c to 25e for pound rolls. Eggs are scarce; for store lots 25c per dozen is the ruling price; for strictly fresh-laid, 27c to 30c per dozen.

Poultry-Prices are not as strong as a week ago; dressed chickens, which comprise the bulk of the offerings, sell at 60c to 80c for the ordinary run; by the pound. 10c; for live chickens, 8c per lb, or 45c to 65c per pair; old fowl sell at 5½c to 6c per lb alive, and 8c dressed; dressed ducks sell at 70c to \$1 10 per pair; alive, 65e to 85c per pair; turkeys are slow of sale, at 13c to 14c per lb, the latter price or nice hen turkeys.

Dressed Hogs-Sales are brisk and prices firm, at \$8 25 to \$8 50 per cwt. Live Hogs-The price here last Monday was \$5 50 per cwt; for next Monday's hipment it is expected that \$5 75 will be paid, and probably a little more, if the market warrants it; fat sows bring \$4 25 to \$4 50 per cwt.

## SCHOOL COUNCIL CANNOT INITIATE

Advisory Board To Be Used Merely to Suggest and Recommend.

Toronto, Nov. 20.-The date has not yet been fixed for the first meeting of the newly-elected advisory council, but Dr. Seath, who represents the Minister of Education on the council, gave it out this morning that there are several matters standing over for discussion, which will necessitate calling the members together before the end of the year.

The superintendent of education is busy working out the details of procedure in connection with the council. but it is understood that they will only deal with questions submitted by the minister, and have no right of initia-"No exact details have yet been set-

tled," Dr. Seath said, "but there is an honest intention to make it a useful council, and to deal with it as thoroughly representative of the various school interests of the Province, and as voicing the desires and opinions of the teachers. "So far as is legitimately consistent

with responsible government, the representations and wishes of the council will receive the utmost consideration.' The subjects upon which the council may be called upon to advise will include the departmental regulations governing the courses of study, and the text books for all classes of provincial schools, continuation classes, manual training departments and school gardens, the qualifications of teachers and inspectors, and the departmental examinations. The council has also executive powers

in connection with the appointment of examiners for the annual departmental and matriculation examinations, and their conduct and results. The Ottawa University has not yet
