GOV'T BLAMED FOR THE CATTLE RAIDS

Agrarian Troubles of Emerald Isle Under Discussion in the British House.

London, Jan. 30.—Heated charges of cowardice in turning a blind eye to the "reign of terrorism" in Ireland in order to keep the Nationalists in good temper, and assure a continuance of their support in the Commons, were launched against the Government in the House of Lords today.

The Marquis of Londonderry, who was viceroy of Ireland in 1886-89, led in the attack, and so infectious were his sentiments that even Lord Langford, who has been a representative peer of Ireland since 1884, broke his silence of 24 years and devoted his maiden speech to a recital of his personal experiences with cattle driving outside his own gates.

SENDS DOCTOR TO JAIL

New York, Jan. 30.—Dr. Walter H. Morris, the young dentist whose automobile ran down and killed Marcus J. Jacobs, manager of the Columbia Theater, at Newark, N. J., on Sept. 25 last, was sentenced yesterday by Judge Teague in the court of quarter sessions to eighteen months in the penitentiary.

STOESSEL'S FATE SETTLED SOON

The Testimony in the General's Court-Martial Has All Been Heard.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 30.—The taking of testimony by the court-martial which is trying Lieut.-Gen. Stoessel for the surrender of the Port Arthur fortress to the Japanese came to an end today and the court adjourned until Feb. 4, when the closing arguments of the judge advocate and counsel for General Stoessel and the other defendants will be heard.

Port Arthur, Jan. 30.—The two-year-old daughter of G. Gallagher took a bottle of strychnine from her father's grip at the family home here, and after drinking part of it, died in a few minutes.

Melbourne, Jan. 30.—The remains of the two persons killed west of Middlemiss last Saturday or Sunday are still here at G. W. Spenceburg's undertaking-room unidentified. They are evidently boys between the ages of 12 and 16, and supposed to be Indians.

After an objection had been taken, an account of a new bylaw, to give Albert Hughes, a one-armed man, a grant, a number of the councillors, led by ex-Warden Hodgins and Councillor Oakes, jumped to their feet, and offered to start the making up of a substitute for him by giving anything up to \$5 apiece.

The act is called the "liquor dispensary act," and in general confines the selling of intoxicating liquors to regularly licensed dispensaries. It is not proposed to bring the act into effect until July, 1909.
