## What You Ought to Do When Baby Has the Colic

By DR. LEONARD KEENE HIRSHBERG, A. B., M. A., M. D., (Johns Hopkins University.)



such times are even good for him, since they help to expand his chest and lungs. If a baby's cries, on the other hand, are prolonged, and if a squirm or wriggle of his wee figure accompanies them, he is probably suffering from colic. When a baby has colic his cry is persistent; he kicks his little legs, clenches his little flsts, twists and turns and suffers. If the colic is very bad, you can see baby's face grow blue and his little mechanism becomes cold. He appears at times quite exhausted after a long period of alternate straightening and bending of the legs, arms and trunk.

Colic is a savere pain in the abdomen caused by the spread of gas. It is often brought about by chilling of the mechanism through insufficient clothing, overfeeding is sometimes as much as anything a cause of colic as either of the two.

Do not feed your baby when you suspect that he is suffering from colic. Although rown milk may allay the pain should be mixed with an equal.


