QUEBEC HAS WON PLACE AS LEADER **AMONG PROVINCES**

Hon. Walter Mitchell Reviews Development in All

Montreal, March 17.—That the Province of Quebec stands at the head of confederation was the statement made by the Hon, Walter Mitchell, provincial treasurer, in his address before the Montreal Women's Club yesterday afternoon in the Central Y. M. C. A. hall, Drummond street. The speaker produced facts and figures to prove that in point of area, natural resources and financial stability this province surpasses any other in the dominion, and pointed out how this proud position as regards finance and development had been won within the last fifteen years. fifteen years. In a comprehensive review of the

In a comprehensive review of the Government's financial policy from 1905 to 1920, and more particularly an account of his stewardship during the past six years. Mr. Mitchell impressed his hearers with the wealth and importance of their native province, and the care being taken by the Government in administering this wealth. Twenty-five years ago, said the speaker, thousands of the inhabitants of Quebec were deserting Canada for the United States to find employment, and every year the Government reported a large deficit in the public treasury, while today thousands are coming into the province to obtain employment, and last year's surplus of \$95,000 was a fair example of the surplus of revenue above expenditure being declared every year.

Exact ligures showing the sources of revenue were given and the succession tax was declared to be most fair, as it was a rule levied on those who had done little or nothing to amass the fortune taxed, while the fortune itself had been brought together, in most cases, from the manipulation of the natural resources of the province.


