- 2. (a) The society has three sources of funds, a \$10 annual registration fee, corporate memberships of \$250 for industry and the profits of the sale of 12 periodicals. On a local level, each chapter has a minimal annual fee and to supplement this, other activities are carried out such as selling books on solar heaters, houses, etc. In addition to this, half of the corporate membership goes to the local chapter in the region in which the industry is located. (b) The Department of Energy, Mines and Resources has made one grant of \$35,400 to the society to help defray its operations. There have been also some grants made for conferences; both Central Mortgage and Housing and the Division of Building Research of the National Research Council made grants of \$2,500 to the society for publishing the proceedings of the "Potential of Solar Energy for Canada" conference which was held in Ottawa in June of 1975. A \$2,400 grant was also made by the National Research Council for the "Sharing the Sun '76" conference which was held in Winnipeg in August, 1976. The department of industry and commerce of the Manitoba government made a grant of \$5,000 to the society for this conference as well.
- 3. Besides being a means of creating a public awareness of the utilization of solar energy in Canada, the Conferences held by the society have served to create government interest in solar energy. This in turn will hopefully lead to increased government expenditure on research in the area of solar energy. In particular, the joint conference of the American section of the International Solar Energy Society and SESCI: "Sharing the Sun '76", which was held in Winnipeg in August, 1976 brought an awareness of international developments to the attention of the various levels of the government in Canada. Another major accomplishment of the Winnipeg conference was that the wide range of technical and policy papers which were presented have been outlined in 10 volumes of proceedings. These volumes constitute a very comprehensive documentation of the international status of solar energy. The chapters have concentrated on the dissemination of information on solar energy to the public by means of public meetings, extra copies of their newsletters, etc. With the same purpose in mind, chapter members have also given courses and lectures on such topics as the construction of your own solar water heater. A course such as this was given at Ryerson last year. The London chapter held a picnic where all the food was cooked on solar cookers and a contest was held by the B.C. chapter for the best solar collector designs. These are just two examples of some of the novel activities which were carried out by the individual chapters.
