And so it is here; if Dr. Thomas' Eclectic Oil was not an article as good as represented it would not have the popularity it has, and if it were not popular it would not be imitated. But thanks to a sense of fairness existing among the drug and medicine dealers, and a desire on their part to preserve their good name from the stigma of "dealers in counterfeit or imitation goods," those LAND PIRATES have not had any encouragement, and their trash has gone begging on the market.
