BLANDFORD, HUBBARD'S COVE, CHESTER, &c.

The Rev. R. Payne has been permitted, in the good providence of God, to continue his labours without intermission during the past twelve months, at the above places. The following is Mr. Payne's report for the past year:

I have included in the present report a description of my missionary duties for a month, from which the nature of those duties for the year may be perceived. To which is added an extract from my journal; with a schedule of duties for the past year, concluding with remarks upon the Society's School now in my charge.

The first Sunday in the month I proceed to Hubbard's Cove, 12 miles distant; where Divine Service is held, alternately, morning and afternoon. I also walk to Fox Point, 1½ miles from the Cove, where the other service is held, in the morning or afternoon alternately. At Hubbard's Cove the congregation is near 200. At Fox Point, where service is held in a Schoolhouse, it is something less than 100. During the summer I usually return to Chester the same evening, but at other periods, I leave for home on Monday mornings sufficiently early to be in time for School.

The second Sunday in the month I go by water to Blandford. Morning Service is held at the Blandford School-house, where an attentive congregation of above 100 assembles. The School-house being too small for the present congregation even, the
