Rector, shall be held by the said Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry for the uses and trusts expressed in the grant or conveyance thereof, subject to the sole management and direction of such Rector, and be used and enjoyed by him for the best benefit and advantage of himself and his successors, in like manner as glebe lands are held and enjoyed in England; but he shall have no power to fell, cut down, or take away the timber or wood growing on any part thereof without the authority of the Church Wardens and Vestry of the said Church expressed by a Resolution at a meeting of the Church corporation.

28. In case of the death or absence from the Province of the Rector of any Church, or where no Rector shall have been appointed, the Church Wardens and Vestry in such Parish shall have the full authority herein given to the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of such Church.

29. The Rector shall preside at all meetings of the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry, and at all meetings of Parishioners or persons entitled to vote for the election of Church Wardens and Vestrymen, or other purposes connected with the Church of England in such Parish, at which he may be present. If there be no Rector, or he shall not be present at any such meeting, a chairman may be appointed by those present and qualified to vote, and the business proceeded with as if the Rector were present at the same.

30. The Rector shall fix the hour and place for all such meetings, unless the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of any Church shall otherwise by bye law or otherwise prescribe: provided that if there be no Rector, or if he shall neglect or refuse on application by a majority of the Church Wardens and Vestrymen to summon any such meeting, the same may be summoned by the Church Wardens or any three Vestrymen at such hour and place as they may ap-

31. Notice of the time and place of all meetings of parishioners or persons entitled to vote at any meeting for the election of Church Wardens and Vestrymen, or for division of a Parish, or for any other purpose, shall be given by affixing such notice on the door of the Church, Churches and Chapels of Ease, (or other place of public worship) of the Church of England (if any) within the parish, at least twenty days before the time appointed therefor.

32. The Church Wardens, Vestry and Pewholders, or other persons qualified to vote in the election of Church Wardens 19 Vic, c 50, s 6. and Vestrymen in each Parish, may assemble in their vestry
