BALDWIN ASLEEP ON REACHING PARIS

Solves New Diplomatic
Problem by Awakening and
Greeting Deputies

PARIS, Oct. 29.—A new problem in diplomacy faced the French when Stanley Baldwin, the British Prime Minister, recently arrived in Paris sound asleep.

The train that brought Mr. Baldwin from his holiday retreat at Aix-les-Bains reached Paris a little later than ten o'clock in the morning. Arrayed in silk hats, representatives of the French government were waiting at the station platform to extend the usual formal greetings accorded visiting heads of foreign governments.
