LIQUOR ON DECK IS WASHED AWAY

Schooner Caught in Heavy Storm From St. Pierre, Miq., to Yarmouth

YARMOUTH Dec. 9.—After a fourteen days passage from St. Pierre, Miq., during which the vessel encountered all the gales and heavy storms which have swept the north Atlantic during that period, the Isaac Harbor, 28 ton schooner Marion Phyllis, Captain J. C. Kirk, put into this port today. Like the crews of run running craft, there is a certain amount of reluctance regarding their experiences at sea, but notwithstanding that, the Marion Phyllis shows the buffeting the craft received.

When the vessel sailed from St. Pierre it carried a full cargo including a deckload of liquor but on arrival here reported at the customs a little more than 1200 packages. The deckload went by the board during the terrific storm of Monday.

The schooner's sails, particularly the jibs, are very badly torn and there are many other evidences of the rough passage the craft encountered.

The Marion Phyllis is an old Yarmouth vessel, formerly the Will O' The Wisp, and was built at Pubnico in 1868.
