



Police Say E. G. Foss, Big Pulp Wood Dealer, Brains of Traffic in Vermont.

Burlington, Vt., Feb. 3.—The arrests at Morrisville of Ernest G. Foss, one of the largest pulp wood dealers in the state, and Alexander I. Stewart, on charges of conspiracy to violate the prohibition laws, was the result of a carefully conceived plan of the federal authorities, in an effort to break up a so-called bootlegging ring in northern Vermont, prohibition agents said tonight. Foss and Stewart, who were taken into custody by Deputy U. S. Marshal Thomas Reeves, were arraigned and held in \$1,000 bonds each.

For months, the federal agents said they have been on the tracks of men responsible for a heavy traffic in smuggled liquor in this part of the state. Jan. 20, they said United States Marshal Lawson swore out warrants here against Foss and Stewart. The latter is a young man, said by the authorities to be in Foss's employ.

For the last two years, according to prohibition agents, smuggling and bootlegging have been conducted on an enormous scale in this district, with Canada as the source of supply. The traffic was apparently carefully organized, and successfully carried on.

Many arrests were made, but in each case the accused had excellent legal advice, and paid the fines imposed by the court. In the arrest of Foss the authorities claim that they have touched the inner circle of the organization. They charge that he has been the brain and money power behind the liquor trade in northern Vermont.
