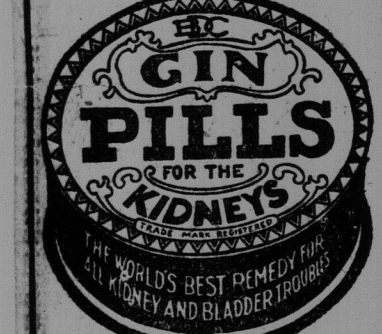

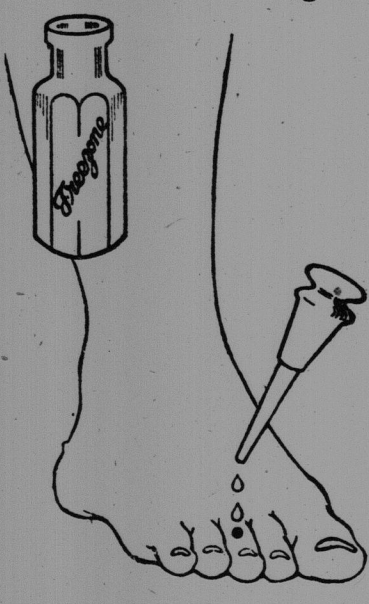

CHARLIE GORMAN PROVIDES A THRILL

Takes Mile from Moore and Kasky After Spectacular Finish—Third in the Half Mile—Logan and Buckley are Winners.

Harry Kasky, the Chicago sprinter, who made such a spectacular showing at Saratoga Lake, and Charles Gorman of St. John provided the sensations of last night's skating in the Donatien championships at Montreal. Gorman won the mile after skating a clever and strong race, in which he was pushed all the way by Joe Moore and Kasky. He came third, behind Kasky and Moore, in the half-mile. Kasky won the 220 yards and the half-mile and came third in the mile. Joe Moore took second place in the half-mile and the mile, but was unable to break through with a win. Gorman won his heat in the senior half-mile, but failed to place in the final. In the point score Kasky leads with 70, and Gorman and Moore are tied for second with 40 each.
