This bureau was organized in 1920, and through Mr. Hull's efforts has had a considerable effect in decreasing the number of couples who seek relief from their dissatisfied state in divorce, says the National Catholic Welfare Council. Prior to the establishment of the bureau the divorce record in this country had increased 150 per cent. Getting at the foundations of this state of affairs, Mr. Hull said: "A generation ago there began to develop a certain movement of discontent and protest which found its expression to a great extent in literature. It is in current literature. A challenge to existing customs commenced to take form.
