## LONDON IS HOME OF MANY QUANT ORGANIZATIONS

Post Office Directory Lists 8,000 of All Kinds, Covering Life from Cradle to the Grave.

London, May 25.—Associated Press by mail.—This seat of a far-flung empire harbors the headquarters of a greater variety of local, national and international orders, associations, missions, alliances, leagues, societies, unions, funds and bursas than may be found in any other city of the world.  
More than 8,000 of them are catalogued in the new post office directory, the "Who's Who and What's What" of London. In a benevolent, protective or prohibitive way they pertain to almost every field of human activity, interest or need. An examination of the list suggests that nowadays there is nothing from deep-sea fighting to higher thought that has escaped the attention of organizers.

A more painstaking perusal might prompt the notion that it would be perfectly safe for human or beast to be reared with or without guardians, masters, education or training, stay out of prison or in there would be agents of an organization of some sort waiting with help or advice at each turn of life's pathway. Even at death the individual would appear to be adequately safeguarded for in the list is enumerated The Society for the Prevention of Premature Burial.

It would be safe to assume that each has a definite reason for being, a specific function to perform, but while most of the official titles of this organized "swelling" make their aims obvious, there are others that, to the uninitiated, sound quaint or ambiguous.  
Such organizations, for instance, as "The Society for Providing the Poor With Bread and Cold in Winter," "The Coal Smoke Abatement Society," and "The Institute of Journalists' Provident Fund," proclaim their objects in admitted fields of usefulness. 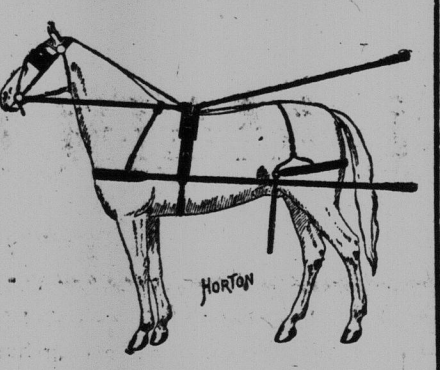

## WHAT SOME TRIPS OF OUR MINISTERS TO OLD LAND COST

Ottawa, May 25.—(Canadian Press).—Expense of Canadian ministers who went to Europe during the war and since were the subject of a return brought down in the house yesterday. It covers the travels of more than a dozen ministers of the crown, including the journeys of both Sir Robert Borden and Hon. Arthur Meighen.

It opens with the trip of the Hon. S. P. Tomin to England, respecting the cattle embargo, which cost \$5,181. Sir Robert Borden's name appears three times in the records. His voyage to England in 1915 cost \$4,292, while his expenses in 1917 were \$3,000. These amounts were advanced to him by the privy council office. From the department of external affairs for his visit at the time of the peace conference he was advanced \$14,793, and returned to the department \$7,471, making the expenses \$7,322.

Mr. Meighen's name appears twice. When he was minister of the interior he was advanced \$1,500; he expended \$87, refunding \$540, and the balance of \$182 was used on western trips. In addition, his journey to the conference of premiers last summer cost \$8,018. Mr. O'Connor.

Ottawa, May 25.—W. P. O'Connor, K. C., Ottawa, received \$8,000 from the department of justice during 1921-22, during 1920-21, and \$18,140 during 1919-20 for his services. This information was given in the house. From August 21, 1919, to June 30, 1921, he received \$7,096.70 from the department of trade and commerce, and during 1921-22 \$5,000 from the department of the secretary of state. It was said that Mr. O'Connor has intimated that he will apply for a "more equitable valuation of his services in connection with revision of the statutes."
