##### MAKE NET FINE-ENOUGH TO ENCLOSE RETAILERS PROFITEERING IN STATES

Washington, Aug. 22.—The net of the government is to be woven fine enough to catch any little retailers of the land found profiteering, according to developments here.

The house committee on agriculture tentatively decided, after hearing Attorney-General Palmer, to leave out the definition of "retailer" as one having gross sales of \$100,000 annually. This would open the way to prosecution of the great mass of retailers whose sales fall under that mark and make them liable to a punishment of two years in jail, \$5,000 fine or both.

Mr. Palmer argued that nothing be put in the way of the department to go after the small retailers operating all over the land. His most forceful argument, in the minds of committee men, was that he wanted to get the corner merchant in the small towns and villages, as well as the big, when they were found profiteering.

CARDINAL GIBBONS CONDEMNNS PROFITEERS. Philadelphia, Aug. 23.—Cardinal Gibbons in an interview strongly condemned profiteering.

The cardinal on his way to Baltimore from Spring Lake, where he spent two weeks, visiting Archbishop Dougherty at the cathedral for a few hours.

"I would like to see in commendation of the Attorney-General Palmer and the administration in the work of curbing the profiteer," said the cardinal.

It is necessary that the high cost of living be reduced, especially when it is shown that one of the reasons for it is that certain persons are obtaining excess profits at the expense of the consumer.

"Profiteering can be justified by nothing, and it should be stopped immediately by as drastic measures as are at the command of the government."

## NO COMBINES, THE GROCERYMEN SAY

Ottawa, Aug. 22.—The Canadian Wholesale Grocers' Association, at this morning's session in the Chateau Laurier, decided to make an official reply to Dr. McFall, cost of living commissioner in Canada, in regard to his statement respecting the sugar shortage in the course of which he alleged unfair tactics to force a high price.

The preliminary statement handed out to the press this morning, was that there were no combines in a committee was appointed to tabulate facts bearing upon such charges and a statement will be given out later.

## WIDER FIELD IN THE HUNT FOR PROFITEERS

Washington, Aug. 23.—Without amendment and with practically no opposition the house late yesterday voted to amend the Lever Food Control Act to extend its provisions to include clothing, containers of food, feed or fertilizers, fuel oil and implements used in production of necessities, and to penalize profiteering by a \$5,000 fine or two years' imprisonment.

## TRADE WITH ENEMY COUNTRIES

Ottawa, Aug. 22.—On the recommendation of the minister of trade and commerce, the deputy governor-general-in-council has ordered the amendment of the order-in-council of June 23, 1919, permitting trading and financial transactions with persons resident or carrying on business in an enemy country with whom residents of the United Kingdom have been or hereafter may be permitted by his majesty's license to trade, by the addition of the following clause: "Provided further that this license shall not permit any person to pay or deliver any sums of money or property which is, or but for the war, would have been due or deliverable to any person or bodies or persons resident or carrying on business in Germany in respect of transactions entered into before the outbreak of the war."

## POLITICAL MATTERS IN CANADA

Vancouver, B. C., Aug. 22.—British Columbia will have a Liberal representation in the House of Commons at Ottawa despite the fact that there are no Liberal members from this province. He will be J. A. Robb, chief Liberal whip in Ottawa, who after listening to charges by the local Liberal executive of neglect of this province by all federal governments, irrespective of party, consented to act in the capacity of British Columbia representative until such time as there is a British Columbia member in Ottawa.

Toronto, Aug. 22.—W. D. Eiler, Liberal M. P. for North Waterloo, in an interview with the Toronto Globe, said positively he has no intention of resigning the seat to make way for Hon. W. L. MacKenzie King.
