London, May 21—An official statement on aerial operations tonight says:
"Since the beginning of the German offensive, exactly two months ago.
1,000 German airplanes have been brought down or driven down out of control and more than 1,000 tons of bombs have been dropped over the enemy's lines.

"During Monday night airdromes in the neighborhood of Ghent, Tournai and St. Quentin used by the enemy's night bombing machines, were heavily attacked. Thirteen tons of bombs were dropped on these and four and a half tons were dropped on the railway stations at Thionville, Metz and Coblenz. "At eight o'clock in the morning of May 21 twenty-two heavy bombs were dropped on the railway stations at Namur and Charleroi. One of our machines
