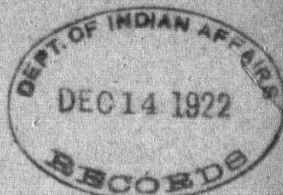

Sir,—

I beg to acknowledge receipt of departmental letter number 30165-5 dated December 4th.

In regard to this I may say that I am quite satisfied that all the material, and the buildings erected by the Seabird Shingle Company on Seabird Island Indian Reserve, was bought and brought in by the company, excepting the shingles on a few of the cabins, but these were all bought from the reserve.

The company has practically vacated. They have not yet taken the machinery away, and had not done anything about the buildings as they had offered them to the Indians for the sum of \$600.00, which I wrote to you about. The company is now awaiting the Department's decision, as to whether they are willing to purchase them on behalf of the Indians or whether they are to remove these buildings.
