The amounts mentioned as received from delinquent rate-payers were reluctantly received by your Secretary, as there were other and proper officers to whom such should and might have been paid, by having the money paid into the Treasury, which are hereto annexed as vouchers.

It may be in order to inform the Council, that the action for trespass which you ordered to be instituted against Donald McArthur, was brought in the Supreme Court, and the Venue laid in Kent. Before giving notice of trial, the Council in the case were of opinion that the cause could not be tried before a Jury of the County of Kent, as each rate-payer, and therefore subject to challenge by the Defendant. Application for change of Venue made in the said County would be ready for trial on the fourth Tuesday of March next.

Pursuant to your instructions the County seal was removed from the office of the ex-Secretary, to the office of your present Secretary, for which your Secretary drew an order for \$4. on the County Treasurer, in favor of Allan Haines who had been appointed according to your further order, the lock of the seal was repaired, an agreement having been made with a young man, St. John, Mr. Idoll, for the same. Mr. Idoll came to Richibucto, and fired the same. His charge is \$12.00 and has an account before you for consideration.

With regard to the proposed survey between the Parishes of Harcourt, St. Mary's, and Wellford, and the order for receiving tenders for running the lines between said Parishes, it may be well to say that some correspondence and conversation has been held with some of the surveyors on the subject, but until such time as information is received from the County Surveyor, the proposed survey will not be commenced. The following is a summary of the amount assessed, and the amounts received from the different parishes, and what their respective delinquencies are--

Richibucto Fireward \$187.50. The Collector of District No. 1, Wellington, owes the County, according to his account submitted, \$188.84. His bonds have been undertaken to pay up the default, and have since paid \$76.45 on this account. The Collector of District No. 2, Richibucto, owes \$84.55, but since rendering his account, he has paid the same to the Treasurer. He has also, from a calculation made, over the County about \$13.05.
