SKETCH OF MRS. J. K. BARNEY.

Few women of the nineteenth century are better known or more beloved than Mrs. J. K. Barney of Rhode Island, whose gentle ministrations in prison and police cell during the past thirty years have earned for her the title of "the Elizabeth Fry of America."

The work for which Mrs. Barney is particularly famous is the "police station system," which has been described as follows: "The police station system inaugurated by Mrs. Barney, and now in vogue in the United States, Ontario, New Zealand and parts of Great Britain, means that a policeman taking a woman into custody has to hand her over to a woman officer at the station, known as the 'police matron.'"

As a platform speaker Mrs. Barney possesses a gift of rare eloquence, which is "permeated with fine, soft but real religious element."
