THIS Association was established in June, 1868. The objects in view are the intellectual improvement of the members and the advancement of the interests of the Institution with which it is identified.

During the winter, Lectures were given in the interests of the Association by Bayard Taylor and Rev. Dr. Fowler, and a Conversazione held in the College.

At the business meeting held May 26th, the Association voted \$10 as a prize for the best Essay on the subject, "Poetry of Common Life," the competition to be open to the school.

They also offer \$20 to be competed for by the Alumnae. The subject for this year is "Self Culture."

The next annual meeting will be held in May, 1878, and will probably be quite as interesting as the last. A full attendance of the Alumnae is requested.
