It was on the evening of the 9th that General Maunoury issued his order to his men to die, if they must, but on no account to give an inch of ground that they held. On the morning of the 10th the French took the offensive again, and the Germans who had lost the battle of Vitry-E-Francois, St. Gonds, and esternay, were thrown but on Soissons.

For the remainder of the battle of the Marne: On September 7th General Franchet, d'Esperey attacked at Esternay General von Buelow and fored him back. On the 8th General Foch held with his right the Guards Corps and three others corps to the east of Le Fere Champenoise, while with his left he threw back von Hausen on the marsh of St. Gonds, and thus forced the German centre to retreat by Eppernay and Rheims. General de Lange de Cary at Vitry-le-Francois, by a movement en echelon from left to right, threw back the Duke of Wurtemberg. Ang General Sarrill at the same time prevented the Crown Prince from turning the alliller right and turned the German left.


