N. B. FEDERATION OF LABOR HEARS RECONSTRUCTION IDEA OF COM.

Various Phases of Industrial Life Reviewed, Taking in Child Labor, Hours of Work, Compensation, Employment of Women, etc., and Recommendations Made to Provin-

Fredericton, March 20.—The following is the report of the Committee on Reconstruction, as adopted by New Brunswick Federation of Labor at the convention held here:

The world war has forced all people to a fuller and deeper realization of the menace to civilization contained in autocratic control of the activities and destinies of mankind.

It has opened the doors of opportunity, through which more sound and progressive policies may enter.

New conceptions of human liberty, justice and opportunity are to be applied. The New Brunswick Federation of Labor, as representing the organized labor movement of this Province, presents the following program for the guidance of its membership, and recommends its careful and thoughtful consideration, to leaders in all branches of life in the Province.

Democracy in Industry.

The establishing of democracy in industry can only be brought about by organization of the workers. It is essential that workers should insist on their right to organize. Thorough organization of industry will provide true co-operation between employees.

Wages.

Standards of wages should be established that will guarantee to the worker an amount sufficient to main.

Where Federal, Provincial and Municipal agencies are established, they should be limited to eight hours, with overtime prohibited, except under extraordinary emergencies. The working week time should be five and a half days.

Women as Wage Earners.

Women workers must not be permitted to exist. Where Federal, Provincial and Municipal agencies are established, they should operate under the supervision of joint committees of the supervision of joint

The Provincial Legislature should protect children by prohibiting their empoyment under sixter years of age.

Exploitation of child life for private gain should not be permitted.
