The Spring Hill coal is well adapted for house, steam and smelting purposes. Situated within 37 miles by rail of the lodes of brown hematite and micaceous iron ore of the richest quality, known as the Acadia iron ore, of Londonderry, it is difficult to assign limits to the quantity of ore likely to be taken to Spring Hill, for smelting by a coal unusually free from sulphur. The large proportion of carbon renders it eminently adapted for manufacturing coke, which, with the coal itself, must be extensively used in the iron and steel works at Londonderry, as well as the Machine shops being erected for the Government railways at Monoton.
