#### ST. JOHN, N.B.

STREAM DRIVINO.—It our last reference was made to the favorable condition of the water in the rivers and streams for bringing out the logs. While it lasted the freshet was very favorable indeed, but coming se late in the season it fell off very rapidly, and considerable quantities of logs were "hung up" in consequence. The great bulk of the logs, however, were get out, and these left behind for the present will, no doubt, all come to market in the course of the season.

STRAISHTS.—Referring to this now element in our lumber carrying trade, its development appears to be quite rapid. Already this season elemen vessels of this description, of an aggregate tonnage of 12,076, have been cleared with deal cargoes. Another (the Anny Dora, 1,107 tons) is now leading, and we hear of five others recently chartered, which may be expected to arrive in a few days. Estimating these latter at 1,000 tons each, we have seventeen steamships of 18,183 tons engaged in this trade up to the present time.

FREIGHTS.—A large number of vessels have arrived in the last few days, and the freight market is much depressed. The latest transaction reported, was at 53/. for Liverpool, which may be quoted as about the market rate to-day.


