

In spite of its simplicity, this model is attractive, and will develop effectively in any of the dress materials now in The fronts are shaped and vogue. crossed, the closing being affected at the left side near the armseam. Deep Gibson tucks add to the apparent width. The skirt is plaited below a wide belt. A flat collar finishes the neck edge. The pattern is cut in four sizes: 4, 6, 8 and 10 years. It requires $3\frac{1}{2}$ yards of 40-inch material for a six year size.

The skirt is gracefully draped at the side, where it joins a shaped back panel. The fronts are slashed near the hem, and finished with a small insert, Dart tucks confine the fullness over the hip. The model is effective for serge, broad cloth, panama, voile, velvet, cor-duroy, satin or silk. As here shown gray prunella was used, with trimming of self-covered velvet buttons, and insert of velvet. The pattern is cut in five sizes: 22, 24, 26, 28 and 30 inches waist measure. It requires 23/4 yards of 44inch material for a 24 inch size.
