Tanton wins overall title

It seems more than appropriate that this being international women's year Beth Tanton of the Township of Mississauga Aquatic Club would hold her own one woman show at the Hamilton Invitational swim meet on the weekend.

Beth grabbed an unprecedented seven first places finishes to go along with a third to win the overall 15-16 year-old girls' category at the meet.

Beth recorded firsts in the 200 metre individual medley with a time 2:34.8, 100 metre breast stroke in 1:12.5, 200 metre freestyle in 2:16.5, 100 metre freestyle in 1:03.4, 200 metre fly in 2:28.2, 200 metre breast stroke in 2:32.9 and the 400 metre freestyle in 4:41.2. The only event that Beth failed to capture was the 100

metre fly with a time of 1:03.4.

Sisters Donna and Robin Loucks continued the female domination in the club as they both won a pair of first place titles in their respective age groups.

Donna recorded firsts in the 100 and 200 metre breast stroke while sister Robin duplicated that mark in the 10-11 year-old category.

Older sister Jackie Loucks had to settle for a pair of second place finishes in both the 100 metre and 200 metre breast stroke events but did manage to break the previous Ontario mark in the 200 metre breast stroke with her time of 3:03.1.

In other ladies' results, Kathy Kent placed sixth in girls 15-16 400 metre freestyle with a time of 5:07.4. Jackie

Keuper had a pair of third place finishes in the 100 and 200 metre fly with times of 1:12.3 and 2:39.3 respectively. Lori Cobham rounded off the ladies' results finishing fourth in the 200 metre fly with a time of 2:59.2 and eighth in the 200 metre back stroke.

For the boys, Richard White finished highest placing second in the boys 13-14 year-old metre breast stroke in a time of 2:51.2. White also

placed sixth in the 100 metre breast stroke.

Blair Hicken swam strongly in the 10-year-old group finishing fourth in the 100 metre breast stroke and sixth in the 100 metre fly. Hicken's times were 1:25.5 and 1:38.8 respectively.

Wrapping up the results for the boys was Mark Strup who placed ninth in the 200 metre breast stroke event.
