Dear Mr. Morgan:

had with me regarding the question of the second homestead for your-self. I may say I have taken up the matter with both the Department of the Interior and the Soldier Settlement Board. Below is an extract from a letter I have received from the Soldier Settlement Board, from which you will see they are desirous of some further information:

"We have a T.G. Morgan at Glemboro, Man. This was was established under the act in Nov. 1919 on the S.E. \(\frac{1}{2} \) 5-9-13 W. 1. by leans for the removal of encumbrances, purchase of stock and equipment and the erection of permanent improvements. In view of the advances granted him for removal of encumbrances and permanent improvements, he is not eligible under Section 15 of the act to obtain additional land by soldier grant entry unless specially recommended by the Board.

It would materially assist the Board if you could supply us with Mr. Morgan's regimental number. If it is found that your correspondent and the soldier settler above referred to are one and the same the question of granting Mr. Morgan special authority to file soldier grant entry, providing he locates a quarter section within nine miles of his present farm, will be taken up with the Superintendent of the Board at Winnipeg and the applicant advised accordingly."
