had already been brought to bear upon the Government at Washington and the latter were finding it increasingly difficult to resist these demands. Nevertheless, it is submitted that extreme care should be taken in developing this argument, since it is in most cases impossible to present actual proof of the existence of these dangers and might leave the Government open to the attack of the Opposition on the grounds that such threats were of no practical consequence.
