With reference to the visit of the late Council of the Caughnewagas to the Department on January 10th last, when the desire was expressed that certain persons should be removed from the Caughnewaga Reserve, I now beg to inform you that William, Telesphore and Osiar Beloché, and Blance and Napoleon Gibson are considered to be Indians and members of the Caughnewaga band. As to these, therefore, no action will be taken, but attention will now be directed towards the removal of Mrs. Ferras and family and some others who are undoubtedly upon the reserve without right.
