immediately before 178 has been through inadvertence been read as No. 177.

No. 169. The cause of increase is due to a birth.

MOOSE FACTORY BAND.

No. 53 In 1908 7 persons were paid under this number. In 1909 only 4 shares were paid . One person was transferred to No. 98 and one to No. 100 and one died.

MOOSE FACTORY BAND (Missanabie.)

No. 2. At the time of the making of the treaty this boy was at school at Sault Ste Marie. He was not put on the pay-list by the Treaty Commissioners owing to the fact that his name was not reported. He was placed on the pay-list in 1909. Arrears are due him from 1905.

FLYING POST BAND.

Nos. 42 ± 45. The pay-list for 1906 shows that \$40.00 was paid to Nos. 43 and 43. Later it was ascertained that these persons are on the pay-list under No. 17 Ojibeways paid at Chapleau. A refund of the \$40.00 was obtained, but through inadvertence the matter was overlooked when the pay-list submitted to your Government was prepared.

No. 47 The Indian Agent when making payments added this number in the pay-list and gave the following explanation, "This woman is bland, never received treaty but is entitled and is very meedy".

MOOSE FACTORY BAND, Chapleau Division.

No. 21. In 1906 and 1907 this family of 5 persons did not appear at the pay-table. In October 1907 Agent West made application to the Department for arrears and gratuity for 5 persons for 1906 (\$40.00)
