It has an invested capital which cannot be touched for distribution purposes of \$17,256.36 exclusive of the gift of \$18,000 from the late Hon. Wm. Mc-Master, inclusive of that \$27,256.36. The total raised in capital and expenditure is \$56,471.36.
