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to secure the \$10,000 were never paid, but other pledges and donations made up the deficiency. In 1868 the Society began to aid those for whose benefit it was formed, giving that year \$480. Since that time it has distributed among aged ministers, widows, and orphans \$29,215. It has an invested capital which cannot be touched for distribution purposes of \$17,256.36 exclusive of the gift of \$18,000 from the late Hon. Wm. McMaster, inclusive of that \$27,256.36. The total raised in capital and expenditure is \$56,471.36.
