DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR.

The Department of the Interior was creat-
ed in 1873. It administers Crown Lands in
the Province of Manitoba, the Northwest
Territories, and for twenty miles on either
side of the Canadian Pacific Railway in
British Columbia. This includes the grant-
ing of homestead entries, leasing of ranch
lands, timber limits and mining locations,
and the sale of school lands; also the man-
agement of the Ordnance and Admiralty
lands in the several Provinces.

It is also charged with the survey of Do-
minion lands and the business connected
with the land subsidies granted the C.P.R.
and other Railway Companies; the settle-
ment of Halfbreed claims and military
bounty warrants, and the granting of fore-
shore lands between high and low water
mark in the different Provinces.
