GOOD TEST WORK IN EASTERN ONTARIO.

In writing Farm and Dairy a few days ago Mr. K. M. Dalgleish, Low Bank Stock Farm, Komora, reports some particularly good test work carried out in his name during the winter season. Mr. Dalgleish says:

"I have just completed some testing which turned out fairly well considering the fact that I had the cows on test just at the time of our sale and milkers and feeders were changed and considerable commotion around the place. Netherland made a record of 35.14 lbs. butter in seven days and one of 17 lbs. in 14 days. This we believe, the highest record ever made in Canada by a cow with only three teats, as she has one blind quarter. Another daughter of King Pontiac Aris Canada made 31.17 lbs. butter in seven days—at 3 yrs., 3 mo., 29 days. This heifer developed a month before her time. She is a daughter of "Paul De Kol Aggie Queen 557," who is a sister to Mr. Colman's great, old, famous Aris Aris Queen. 22 lbs. butter in seven days and sold in public auction for \$2,000. Another daughter of King Pontiac Aris Canada, made 21.70 lbs. butter in seven days and 43.24 lbs. in 14 days as a three-year-old. This heifer was milked up to within two weeks of freshening, as I did not intend testing her this year."

EGGS AND POULTRY.

The egg market is steady at the prices noted last week. Receipts are liberal, but more moderate prices, coupled with high prices for meat, tend to increase consumption. On this market now laid eggs in cartons are quoted 35c to 37c, and six-cantons, 34c to 35c. On the Montreal market fresh eggs are quoted 35c to 37c. **Chicken.**—Dressed, Old stock, pound, 12c to 13c 13c to 14c 14c to 15c

HIDES AND WOOL.

Wholesale dealers are paying for country hides as follows: Hides, fat, cured, 17c to 17½c; lb. part cured, 16½c to 17c; green, 15c to 16½c; calfskins, cured, 30c to 31c; part cured, 18c to 19c; doe-skins or bob, 12.5c to 13.50 each; lambskins, take-off, No. 1, 14.75 to 15.50; No. 2, 12.75 to 14.00 each; sheepskins, No. 1; horned-lamb, farmers' stock, 37c to 40c a lb.
Wool—washed fleeces, in to quality, 45c to 47c a lb.; washed rejection (dirty,

clotted, chaff, etc.), 35c to 37c; unwashed fleeces, in to quality, 31c to 35c; north-western, unwashed, according to quality, 27c to 30c.

DAIRY PRODUCE.

The dairy produce market is firm. Ponderable is coming in in greater quantities than last year, and payment to an extent has been made. Receipts are increasing, but dairy butter is scarce. On this market received creamery prints are quoted 54c to 57c; solids, storage, 52c to 54c, and dairy prints, 57c to 58c. Unsalted cream is choicest creamery, 33c to 34c; seconds, 31c to 31½c.

LIVE STOCK.

Quotations have ruled strong on Toronto live stock markets this past week. At no time during the week have receipts been heavy, and throughout from farmers and butchers has always been steady. As a result, prices have hardened all round. On the Western market, one well finished steer, weighing 1,700 lbs., brought the top price of \$7. Everything at all well finished, commanded immediate sale. A noticeable feature of the market continues to be the demand for steers, for both Canadian and United States points, and principally the latter. The sales point to move cattle on Ontario farms this coming summer.

Milk cows are in only moderate demand, severity of being being moderate. Choice milk cows are in demand, and are being sold at \$17.50 to \$19.50, and best calves, each, \$14 to \$7.

Medium calves and firm Lambs are more numerous and a trifle heavier, bringing \$10 to \$11 a cwt. and light ones up to \$11.50. The few spring hams offered bring \$5 to \$6. Other quotations are: Lard, cured, \$2 to \$2.50; heavy sheep and hogs, \$8 to \$7.75; mutton, 14 to \$5.50.

Receipts of hogs have been liberal, but the demand has been firm, and to this supply. Packers are quoting \$11.50 to \$12.00 for select washed out cans; \$11 to \$11.75 for red and watered; and secondary points, \$10.50 to \$10.75; light and heavy (not subject to a discount of 50c, and heavy \$2.50).

The live stock market at Montreal has been stronger this past week. Choice steers and heifers command \$5.50 to \$5.75; good, 5c to 5.25, and lower grades, 5c to 4.75; butchers' cows, 4.75 to 5.25; heifers, 3c to 3.75. Yearling heifers command \$11.75 to \$12; sheep, 7.25 to 7.50; spring lambs, \$5 to \$5 each. Calves were in active demand at 5c to 7c for good to choice, and \$2 to \$4 each for less choice. There is a good demand for select hogs at \$11.75 to \$11.95 washed out cans.
