EDWARD DUKE OF KENT was the fourth son of George III, and father of QUEEN VICTORIA. He died 1820.

On the fly-leaf is the following interesting yet melancholy reminiscence, "Queen's Lodge, Windsor, June, 1800. Given for the use of Her Royal Highness, the Princess Charlotte, by the Queen. The Princess was born 1796, at which time the separation took place between George IV. and Queen Caroline. The Princess, who was afterwards married to Leopold of Saxe-Cobourg, died in childbirth, November, 1819.
