

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# The Farmers' Market

## WINNIPEG MARKET LETTER

Office of The Grain Growers' Grain Company Limited, April 18, 1917.  
Wheat—New high records were made in wheat prices last week and closing prices on Saturday showed May futures in the Winnipeg market only 1 cent below the high mark. As is natural at these levels, the markets are nervous and subject to rapid fluctuations, making it difficult to execute market orders and consequently the volume is greatly curtailed. Although the lack of moisture has been relieved in the winter wheat areas, the distant months fully have been affected. Nearby months are showing continued strength, influenced by light offerings, a very strong cash demand to the south and possibly congestion in Chicago May. Reports from the lakes indicate that the opening of navigation will not take place before the first of May.

Oats—Oats prices have refused to follow the advance in wheat, and Saturday's close for May oats is only 1 cent higher than a week ago.

Flax—Flax prices are going strong and show a gain of 16 cents for the week. New high levels have been made in this grain also. Reports say that the Argentine crop is a failure and crushing interests are competing strongly for offerings in the American and Winnipeg markets.
