DO NOT CROSS BREEDS

Influence of a Pure-bred Sire on a Herd

With the first cross of a pure bred sire with an ordinary herd of cows the resulting heifers will have 50 per cent. of the blood of the sire. The second cross brings heifers with 75 per cent. of the third cross gives 87 1/2 per cent. a warning of two crosses nearly 94 per cent. Fourth generation females when bred to a pure bred sire of agreeing blood have only about six per cent. of the scrub blood to contend against the blood of the sire.

But some farmers are unwise in their subsequent breeding. They are quite apt to change breeds, thinking wrongly that they are going to get the best qualities of both the breeds. Almost invariably the result is one of disappointment for these sires, at once a warning of two crosses nearly that of the sire and that of the dam. Very much better cows will be produced by keeping the herd steady in line with the blood of the original sire.

But the farther on this road we go the more careful a breeder should be always to select bulls of strong propensity. When we change sires it is best to select one that has a fairly close family relationship. In this way we take advantage for a progeny of agreeing and not contending tendencies.

By making a close study of this matter a farmer can build up in a few years a splendid herd of grade cows which will command a big price whenever offered for sale. But very rigid selection should be maintained by selling off the older as well as the poorer cows, keeping the heifers to prove correctness of the breeding theories that have been followed.

INSECT TRAVELLERS

Ship cargoes are often responsible for the introduction of quite new species of insects in different lands. Banana bunches often hide poisonous reptiles and insects which travel long distances only to bite or sting the land of some receiver of fruit. Often they escape alive and breed their kind. Many venomous snakes have thus been introduced into lands where none existed before. Stray creatures have been imported on the blooms of orchids, and West Indian insects have travelled in Easter lily blossoms. Destroying moths migrate in fruit ships. Flying insects often follow ships. One curious case was that of a vessel from the tropics followed by a swarm of butterflies. Out of sight of the shore, they hid in the cabins and holds, emerging forty days later when the ship reached England. Thus originated quite new species of butterfly in the British Isles.

CULTURE IN SASKATCHEWAN

President Murray, in a Report, Says it is Broadening. Gratifying it is to read the annual report of President Murray, of Saskatchewan, on the new spirit in that province. Referring to the broadening out and general culture he says: "We are all greatly gratified to find that the university is appealing to students of the different nationalities in the province and that these students are attaining such high distinction. Most cordially are they welcomed to the university. The life of this province is being greatly enriched by the artistic, literary and musical gifts which they and their people are bringing to us. We of Canadian birth do not realize to the full how much Saskatchewan owes to European culture. Every musical festival, each convention, be it grain growers, home-makers of municipalities, but deepens the conviction that the high character due to the training and culture of Britain and the continent of Europe. Unless we exert ourselves to the utmost for the next generation will fall far behind the present in intellectual and artistic attainments."

Big English Foxes. A dog fox was killed at Upwood, near Kitchikley, Yorkshire, weighing 28 pounds 14 ounces. That weight is most unusual. The average weight of a dog fox is about 15 pounds or 16 pounds and a veteran 12 pounds or 13 pounds. The heaviest which we can remember to have heard of was one of 23 pounds, which was killed by the Ullswater Foxhounds on the Cross Fell Range. The huntsman, Joe Bowman, who reported it in 1900, stated that he had weighed hundreds, and this was the largest he has ever killed. It measured 4 feet 4 inches from tip of nose to tip of brush, and about 4 inches of the brush was white. He added that the majority of foxes on Cross Fell weigh about 15 pounds to 20 pounds, which is considerably above the average elsewhere.

Lord Fisher's Family. Hearty congratulations Lord Fisher, "the modern Nelson," as he has so often been termed, who was married on April 4th, 1866, to Miss Frances Broughton, a parson's daughter. There have been four children of the marriage, three daughters and a son. The son is the Hon. Cecil Vavasour Fisher, the owner of Kilverstone Hall, whom his father takes his title, which, it is feared, may not continue after his son; for Mr. Fisher, who was married in 1910, has no children. His wife is one of the few women to hold a license as a master mariner.
