A PRINCE ALBERT LETTER

Editor Reporter:

Dear Sir,—I told you I would write from this point, and with pleasure I am now doing so. This town is booming and the country is settling up fast. They all say "this is the country," and no doubt it is for some. Everybody seems to be on the move, and the place is improving very fast. There is lots of timber here, good saw mills and fine residences.

The trip here seemed a long and a slow one, but we had a jolly company in our car and passed the time quite pleasantly. We had a few minutes to wait at Winnipeg, and I saw several old friends, the first being J. H. McLaughlin. At Regina we had to stay from 9 p.m. to 10 a.m., and there being no accommodation obtainable about 40 had to remain in the station, getting no rest. Duck Lake, 230 miles from Regina, was our getting-off place, and from there we drove in a spring wagon 27 miles across the prairie. We had at one place to cross the river on a "scow," and the tanks were so steep that we had all to walk to the top, a distance of half a mile. We left Duck Lake at 6 o'clock and reached our destination, the home of Mrs. Wilson's five brothers, at 3. These men all have fine farms, which they get free and which will be worth a good sum of money in a year or two, as a railway is to pass through their locality.

Am pushing the sale of nursery stock over a large area and, of course, am seeing considerable of the country. I noticed out from Winnipeg the grain is all out and in stock, but very little stacked or threshed. I think there will be two good months' work here at threshing and storing the grain. There is no trouble to get work at \$2.50 and \$2.72 per day; some report getting \$3.00.

Men are here from all parts looking for land, and I am amused to hear them talk. Everything looks bright and clear for people here, but as for me, my dear old native home is the place for me.
