The census returns shows Brockville population in June last to have been 9,372, against 8,940 in 1901, an increase in ten year of 432. The only two towns in Ontario to show a decrease are Cornwall and Lindsay, the former 106 and the latter 47.

The hen that is going to do the heavy laying the coming winter was hatched early last spring. During December and January pullets usually lay about four times as many eggs as an equal number of hens. One of the United States experiment stations made a year's laying test, beginning with pullets and one and two-year old hens, giving each of the three lots equal advantages. The pullets laid about twice as many eggs as the two-year-old hens, while the second lot had a record about halfway between. In rare cases a hen may pay for her keeping after she is two year old.

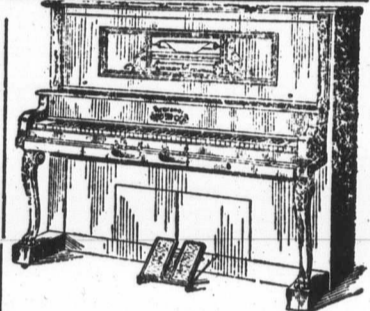
