## BLUFF AT RUSSIA.

The Ameer of Afghanistan Makes a Great Big One.

He Says Britain's Troubles Are His Troubles and he is Willing to aid in Crushing the Boers.

London, March 10.—The Ameer of Afghanistan has authorized his agent in London to publish the following statement of the policy of Afghanistan towards Great Britain and Russia:-"After saying that he had devoted much anxious thought to the possibility of Russia taking advantage of the Transvaal war to advance through Afghanistan on India His Highness

"I have come to the conclusion that Russia feared Afghanistao, as a war with the Alghans would mean a general rising of all Islam, which would spread through Russian Asia. Russia had not troops enough to combat such a rising. Her hold on the Mussulman countries she had concuered in incountries she had conquered is in-secure. They hate her, and with ten times her power Russia could not fight Afghanistan and India successfully. The Afghans prefer death to slavery, and their women and children taken by the Russians.''

After saying he is willing to send numerous troops to help Great Britain in the Transvaal, but adding that the Afghans are unaccustomed to the sea, the Amear says:—"But England's troubles are always my troubles, her strength is my strength, and her weak-ness is my weakness. England must remember that I am always ready to fight for her on land, here or in

The Ameer refers to a letter from the Indian Government reminding him that he has been faithful for twenty years, and advising retrenchment in purchases of arms, as otherwise Parliament might become suspicious. He takes strong exception to such suspicions, saying it was necessary to keep the country strong enough to lesist a

Russian advance.

The Ameer concluded by likening the British Parliament to Cabul Turkish baths "which reverberated with a basel of calls for towels, soap, etc., and loud voiced conversation, until the meaning of individual words, or even the words themselves became lost in confusion of sounds and only increased the general up-roar.

Unele Sam's Wonderful Highting Ship. The most formidable fighting ship in the world is Uncle Sam's new whate

wonder, the Kearsarge.

The Kearsarge is not only the most powerful battle-ship in the world; in many respects she is unique. She is 368 feet long, which eclipses the neight of all but a few office buildings. Her extreme beam is 72 feet 2 inches; freeboard forward, 14 feet 3 inches; freeboard aft, 12 feet 4 inches, and mean draught, 23 feet 6 inches.

To a naval engineer these and other measurements mean that the new total has a disp acement of 11 500 tons, hich is seven times as great as that of the original Kearsaige, a memory of whose brave victory the present ship has been named. The old snip's norse-

power, moreover, was less than a twelith of that of the new Kenrsargo.

But with all her beauty, stability an! force, the most interesting feature of the new battle-styp consists in her (w) heavy gun turrets, one placed above the other and both operated by the same mechinery. In the lower curret are two 13-inch guns, while in the smaller turrets are two 8-inch rifles. Experts say that no ship that ever floated could withstand an assult directed from these two turrets working together. The idea is due to Admital Sampson, but its pract cability bas been hotly disputed by other officers Its exact value can be determined only

by experiment, Such trials of the Kearsarge as have already been made have shown that she can probably make more than the sixteen knots an hour guaranteed by her builders.
