

NORTH ONTARIO FIRST

Election Commissioners Get Their First Job Since They Were Appointed in June Last.

Toronto, Nov. 28 .- The elections commission was appointed last June. Yesterday morning Registrar Fal-conbridge received by mail the first complaint. It came from R. M. Noble, barrister, of Uxbridge, and re-lates to the McGillivray-Graham con-

test of 1896.
The complaint is in the form of an affidavit, and states that on a recount it was found by the late Senfor Judge Burnham, at Whitby, that 21 ballots, which had been marked for Graham and counted for him, had been extracted from the packages containing his ballots, and 21 others marked for McGillivray substituted therefore. That is the story told by

the affidavit. the Conservative candidate, Major John A. McGillivray got a majority of one, the voting being 2,328 and 2,327. By the alleged substitution the major's majority was raised to

After the recount Duncan Graham protested the seat, but before the trial came on, and after one session in the House, Major McGillivray re signed. At the bye-election Duncan Graham was elected, defeating Augus McLeod by 17 votes. In the re-cent election Mr. Graham fell by the wayside, a victim of the popularity of Angus McLeod. This complaint will likely be heard next week.

Mr. McCleary Nominated. Welland, Ont., Nov. 27.—A large gathering of Conservative delegates was held here to day to select a candidate for the approaching Ontario election, Mr. William McCleary, was tendered the unanimous nomination and accepted it. The contest will be short and sharp.

North Grey Recount, Owen Sound, Nov. 27.—The North Grey recount commenced this morning, before His Honor Judge Creasor, and was adjourned to-night. The result of to-day's recount reduced Dr. Horsey's (Lib.) majority 5. It is now 25.

THE JUBILEE DIAMOND.

Is the Largest and Most Costly of

No single object exhibited at the Paris exposition even remotely approaches in value the gleaming "Jubie" diamond, as it has been called in ommemoration of the jubilee of the reign of the queen of England. It is a diamond of the first water and of a beauty and size that leave anything known heretofore far behind. This largest and most costly of all diamonds weighs in its present shape 239 carats, while the next largest-viz, the "Orloff," crowning the Russian imperial scepter-weighs but 1941/2 carats; also as regards whiteness and fire, as well as in the wonderful perfection of its cut, the "Jubilee" excels all its rivals.

For the time being this Goliath among precious stones is still owned by a syndicate of capitalists connected with the Jagersfontein mine, in which it was found. With regard to the price one can hardly speak about that until the stone has been sold, an event which is doubtless not going to take place in a hurry, for the guard stationed by the showcase containing the sparkling gem gives its value at 8,000,000 francs, whether correctly or not is hard to say. Only one thing seems assurednamely, that the stone shown to the admiring crowds in the palais on the Esplanade des Invalides is paste, while its original is kept somewhere in se cure custody.

This gem was found on June 30, 1893. at Jagersfontein, in the Orange Free State. The stone was picked up by native while he was loading a truck and, although a white overseer was standing near him, he managed to secrete it and kept it on his person for some time. In this case, however, it did not appear that he proposed stealing the gem, but only wished to deliver it personally to the manager. This he did, and as a bonus he received £150 and a horse, saddle and bridle. The diamond weighed in the rough exactly 971% carats, or about 7 1-10 ounces avoirdupois. Unfortunately it had a black spot about the middle, but it was so placed as to allow the stone being cut into two, with the spot falling out.

The Male Shirt Walst.

"This year," says a writer in the Philadelphia Record, "we have merely seen the man in the ordinary negliged shirt who had nerve enough to remove his coat in public. But next year we shall see real shirt watists for men's wear, almost similar to those worn by wdmen. The large shirt manufactur ers are already making them up, and the salesmen will soon start out with their samples, soliciting orders for the spring trade, for the ready made shirt business, like most other large industries, must keep a season ahead.

"A Chestnut street dealer in men's furnishing goods said recently that he understood the new garments would be a complete innovation. They are made with a blouse effect, the waistband to be connected with the trousers by buttons, just as in the garments worn by small boys. Some have broad yokes, and others have plaits both in

the bosom and in the back. "The manufacturers are not staking any chances, though,' said a haberdasher. 'The sales are to be outright and cannot be canceled or modified to suit the demand, as is the case with most staple goods. If we buy them and can't sell them, we're stuck. De I think they will be a go? The haber dasher merely shrugged his shoulders.

Electricity In Mining.

In the first place, its great convenience must be noted. An electric lamp can be placed and used where no othe lamp can and practically any candle power that may be required can be had from it. An electric motor to do certain work is much lighter and bandier than any other form of motor, and the cables which feed it with energy are lighter, handler, more easily got into position and more easily maintained than the pipes required for either steam or compressed air. The electric signal and the electric telephone will do what no other apparatus will. All these are sources of economy in themselves, and the busier the mine the greater the economies effected. But apart from these considerations, the electric motor and the electric system of transmitting power is far more efficient than any other system.

Wales Is the Heir. There has been a story circulated the effect that when Queen Victoria dies the Emperor William would push his claim to the throne as being nearer in the line of succession than his uncle, the Prince of Wales. This could not possibly be, as the cognate law of succession prevails in Great Britain. This law gives the right of succession to the male heirs in the same relation to the sovereign and excludes all female heirs without regard to priority of birth as long as male beirs are living. Queet Nictoria's great-grandchildren are near er to the throne than her own sons, except the Prince of Wales. Marriage to a Catholic debars a prince or princess from the throne of England.

Shooting Around Corners. Two wonderful inventions to enable soldiers to practically shoot around corners are announced. One is a German invention and the other the product of an Englishman's brain, but they both seem to be on much the same principle. The English device is attached to the stock of the rifle, and it enables the marksman to not only sight his weapon behind cover, but also to find his target and his range at the same time. With the German arrange-ment, which the German war office has promptly secured, the seldier is said to be able to sight his rifle while he remains under cover, but all other par-ticulars are withheld.
