

Township Councils.

HARWICH COUNCIL.

The municipal council of the township of Harwich met Saturday, Feb. 13, 1904, at 7:30 p. m. for adjournment. All members present. Minutes of previous meeting read and confirmed.

COMMUNICATIONS.

From J. C. Fleming, treasurer county Kent, stating that during the year ended December 31st, 1903, that he had paid to the treasurer of the municipality \$450.75 as follows: For arrears first half 1903, \$240; Legislative school grant, \$410.00; arrears re government audit \$38.35.

From W. J. Cryderman, clerk of Harwich, stating that he had received from Geo. Barker, notifying the council that Mr. Drader is blocking up the river road with logs and hoping that council would take action in the matter.

From Geo. M. Baird, clerk of Harwich, in reference to the Alexander drain, stating that they had appointed a committee to meet a similar one from Howard to adjust said drain.

W. E. Bottoms, in reference to purchase of road machine. J. Shewburg, R. Gilbert and Chas. Soule, calling attention of council to snow drifts on side road.

L. J. Poulin re charge to T. Nelson for statute labor, claiming that same was performed. No action.

RESOLUTIONS.
Brien—Wilson, that the accounts as read be paid, with the exception of D. McGeech's, which should have been certified to by H. McLarty, commissioner, and that Jas. Leatherdale, commissioner No. 1 division, be instructed to look after the lanterns charged to township. Carried.

Wilson—Galbraith, that the certificate of county treasurer re amount money paid to E. D. Milton \$450.75 be received and placed on file. Carried.

Wilson—Brien, that after hearing the application of H. McLarty, wishing council to accept his resignation as commissioner on the Balmer and Campbell drains, we accept his resignation on the Campbell but not on the Balmer drain, as said drain is under construction and should not have a change. Carried.

Wilson—Galbraith, that Thos. White be refunded the sum of \$4.77 paid on Crutshank drain. Carried.

Galbraith—Leatherdale, that \$80 etc. taxes charged against personal property of Wm. Buckler be struck off as said party has left the municipality. Carried.

Brien—Leatherdale, that the application of A. Dick and A. Greenway for repairing and improving McGargon drain be accepted, and Thomas Soane, C. E., be appointed to make necessary survey and report. Carried.

Wilson—Brien, that the clerk be instructed to correspond with the several parties having gravel for sale to ascertain their prices. Carried.

Wilson—Leatherdale, that the report of J. A. Clark, collector, be received, he having collected \$21,170.44, leaving a balance of \$13.10 uncollected and that he be paid his salary of \$90.00 and \$5.50 postage. Carried.

Brien—Wilson, that this council is willing to meet a committee from Harwich on March 5, in township hall, Ridgeway, re Alexander drain, at 2 p. m. and clerk notify as to same. Carried.

Wilson—Galbraith, that the clerk be instructed to inspect where M. Drader is placing logs on river road and have same removed if an obstruction. Carried.

Leatherdale—Galbraith, that Thos. Simpson be paid \$90 for 12 ewes killed and C. E. Brien \$4.66 for five sheep worried by dogs—charge to dog fund. Carried.

Wilson—Galbraith, that the clerk be instructed to notify M. Wilson, C. E. to take proceedings to have the size of McGregor Creek and Buller drain reduced and the formal order of the court issued. Carried.

Brien—Leatherdale, that Court of Revision on McGregor Creek and Buller drains be adjourned until March 5, at 2 and 2:30 o'clock respectively. Carried.

Galbraith—Wilson, that Jas. Leatherdale be commissioner on Campbell drain instead of H. McLarty, resigned. Carried.

Brien—Wilson, that whereas the present C. T. R. bridge over Thames river is too small and inadequate for free flow of water and in view of the company's decision to build a new bridge in the spring, this council request A. Blair, commissioner on railways to have a larger one built, so that it would not impede the flow of the water. Carried.

Bylaw for re-enclosing the Campbell drain was read a third time and finally passed.

Leatherdale—Galbraith, that the council adjourn to meet March 5, at 10 a. m.—Carried.
