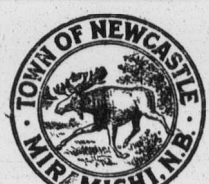

Railway News in Brief

Windsor, Ont.—E. C. Rice, C.P.R. district agent, has relinquished his duties here, after 11 years' service, and has gone to Florida for a three months' vacation, as he has not enjoyed the best of health of late. He is succeeded by W. A. Armstrong for 12 years in the ticket service of the railway company in Toronto.

Kentville, N.S.—The Dominion Atlantic Railway has moved 40,000 barrels of coal to Halifax for export. There are still approximately 250,000 barrels left for export. From the beginning of the season 1,490 more cars of apples were moved than for the corresponding period last year.

St. John, N.B.—During the present season the Canadian Pacific has hauled 2,044 cars of grain containing 4,255,993 bushels which have been unloaded to the elevators at West St. John, as compared with 2,068 cars with 3,735,545 bushels during the corresponding season last year. The elevators at West St. John still contain a million and a half bushels of grain.

The new Canadian Pacific Steamship "Montcalm," which sails between St. John and Liverpool, is equipped with motion pictures. The showing of motion pictures on board ship has proven a big success ever since its inauguration last summer and has met with the same popularity and appreciation by passengers as the Canadian Pacific features. The films are distinctly and characteristically Canadian in subject and treatment.

Victoria, B.C.—There are no better known golf courses in the Dominion than those at Victoria on Vancouver Island, no doubt due to the fact that the game is played every day in the year. It will, therefore, come as a pleasant surprise to know that the Canadian Pacific Railway has completed arrangements whereby guests of the Empress Hotel at Victoria will be accorded playing privileges on the excellent 18-hole Colwood Course.

Winnipeg, Man.—Miss Hazel Tompkins, candidate of the Canadian Pacific Railway employees, is queen of the Winnipeg winter carnival when the voting commenced. Miss Tompkins had 27,855,000 votes to her credit. Miss Katheryn McFarquart, candidate of the Canadian National employees, ran second with 1,232,000 votes and Miss Esther Gervin of the T. Eaton Company, third with 12,434,600. There were 25 candidates. Bonds were sold to finance the carnival, each bond bearing a voting coupon.

There has been more than usual interest manifested since the announcement first made by the Canadian Pacific in December, of the next international Eucharistic Congress which is to be held in Rome in May. The Canadian Pacific, associated with La Compagnie Francaise du Tourisme, is organizing a personally-conducted pilgrimage under the spiritual direction of a well-known Canadian priest. The pilgrimage will include the famous shrines of Italy and France, with special optional tours to the Passion Play at Ober-Ammergau and the battlefields of the Great War.

Edmonton, Alta.—Demonstrations on raising of bacon type hogs, the value of dairy cows on the farm and the value of sheep are being given from the train that has been outfitted by the Alberta Government and is now on tour through the province. The train itself is provided by the C. P. R. and has Thos. Atcheson, C.P.R. agricultural representative in charge. Representing the Provincial Government, S. G. Carlyle, live stock commissioner, is in charge of this work. The speakers include Mr. Carlyle, Guy Herbert, Medicine Hat; G. H. G. Hutton, Calgary; Professor A. A. Dowell, Captain Latimer, University of Alberta; W. L. Carlyle, Calgary and Dr. Morrison of the Dominion Live Stock Veterinary service.

CARIBOU TRACKS SEEN IN DOUGLAS

It is beginning to look as if the caribou were returning to this province. They pulled up stakes and quit about the year 1915, and most of the guides and trappers had made up their minds that they had gone for ever. There is now evidence to indicate that they are coming back. During the present week people living on the road which leads from the Village of Nashwaaksis to Killarney Lake claim to have discovered a trail which they are positive was made by a good sized herd of caribou.

A report to this effect has been made to Chief Game Warden Gagnon and he has been asked to see to it that precautions are taken to prevent them from being attacked by poachers. Those who saw the trail in the snow say that there is not the slightest doubt but that it was the works of the woodland caribou. The caribou has big flat feet and there is no other animal that can make tracks like it. They say that there must have been at least a dozen animals in the herd and they were evidently travelling northward, feeding as they went.

The caribou is conceded by sportsmen to be the best of all big game animals and it is to be sincerely hoped that they are making their way back to this province. Scarcity of feed is supposed to have been the cause of their departure and the supposition is that they quit New Branswick and moved over to the Gaspe Peninsula. The close season placed on them expired last year but will probably be extended by the Legislature for a further period of five years.

ARBUBKLE TRIALS PRETTY EXPENSIVE

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 22—The two trials of Roscoe Arbuckle, on a charge of manslaughter arising from the death of Virginia Rappe, film actress, have cost the city of San Francisco nearly \$13,000, it was disclosed today with the filing of expense sheets. The first trial cost \$5,963.25 and the second \$8,736.71.

Labor Minister Defied By Dominion Power Co.

Hamilton, Feb. 21—The Dominion Power and Transmission Company is defying the ruling of Hon. James Murdock, Minister of Labor, that it must not enforce a wage reduction upon its employees until a Board of Conciliation has investigated and reported. The company has notified him that the reduction went into effect on February 16, and will not be suspended, claiming that the agreement with the unions expired before the Conciliation Board was appointed and therefore, the act does not apply. It also cites the Supreme Court's decision in a similar case concerning the Nova Scotia Coal and Iron Company.

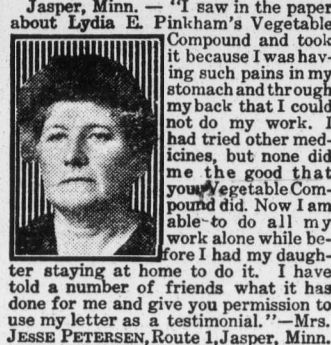
Great Lawyer Left Badly Drawn Will

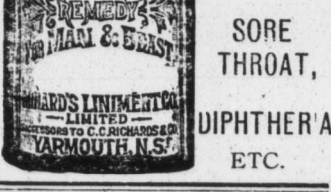
