Van swarms of grasshoppers have settled down upon the fields in the parish of St. Bartholomew, Berthier County, Quebec, and eaten up almost everything in the fields. The wheat and oat crops are completely destroyed.

John Gibson, a farmer living on the Gatesville River, some distance from Ottawa, died the other day from the effects of a wound inflicted by his wife in a family quarrel. She had armed herself with a shovel, and struck him with it on the head.

The Quebec papers state that Mr. Captain Langlois, of Point Levis, who lost the use of his legs last year, has been miraculously cured at St. Anne de Beaupre, P. Q. Five thousand pilgrims visited the shrine on Sunday, the 29th ult.

A heavy thunder storm at Beausport, Quebec, one day last week, was holding the animal by the head, when they were struck by lightning.

The lumber mills of Mr. E. B. Eddy, situated at Birchton, three miles from Ottawa, were destroyed by fire on the afternoon of the 1st inst., together with the season's cut, valued at \$250,000. The total loss will amount to about \$500,000, on which there is insurance for \$300,000. Two employees are missing, and it is thought they are burned.

These prizes will be given to the architect of the two best buildings in the exhibition, one in the class of the Standard Variety. Mr. W. M. Hoppin, of Hopedale, has also offered a prize of \$2,000 for the best sample of butter made without salt.

The Montreal & European Railway Company have filed a claim for \$600,000 against the Dominion Government for breach of contract. The company say that in 1884 they entered into a contract with the Government to build a railroad from Oxford to New Glasgow, P. E. I., with branches to Peggysue and Pictou. After seventy miles of the road had been partially built the Minister of Railways took the work off their hands.
