ssibilities of new industrial ventures in far north waters, steps are stantial share of the steamship traihe that will follow the opening of the Hudson Bay railroad. The powerful steel sealing ships that have been built within the past few years will e promptly utilized by their owners by charterers for this service as soon as the railroad to Fort Churchii or Fort Nelson is completed.

This new sealing fleet in Newfound in the world. Until six years ago Friday's Concert wooden ships were employed entirely for sealing and whaling, as the hulls could be built of solid wood many inches thick and the bows planked with balks to a thickness of two or three feet and then shod with iron bands as a further security in ramming the ice. In 1906, however, the idea was devised of constructing steel ships of special design and so but tressed internally as to give practically the same strength as the wooden vessel. The latter were mostly crafts making not more than five to seven knots in speed, and the largest only 700 tons burden, so that except for this work they could not be pro itably employed and had to remai tied up at the wharves in St. John or ten months of the year.
