There are some figures in our calendar that have a way of cropping up periodically, and faithfully remaining with us. Have you noticed that the figure 9 is one of these numerals that we cannot get rid of?

This figure appeared on January 1 1889, and will be with us 111 years from that date, or until December 31, 1999. No other figure has ever had such a long consecutive run. The 9 itself has only once before been in a race which lasted over a centurythat in which it figured continuously from January 1, 889, until December


