St. John's Municipal Council. PUBLIC NOTICE.

The attention of the Public is called to the Sections of the St. John's Municipal Act, 1921, regarding the keeping of Dogs within the City Limits, and within one mile thereof.

Section 197.—The owner of every dog or bitch kept within the city limits or within one mile thereof in any direction, which is six months old or upwards, shall register such dog or bitch at the City Hall on or before the first day of July of each year, and shall pay to the City Clerk such fees as the Council may determine, for the uses of the city.

Section 198.—The City Clerk shall supply such registered owner with a metal tag for each dog or bitch registered, with the number of registration stamped thereon, and the owner of every registered dog or bitch shall keep on such dog or bitch a collar with the tag attached thereto.

Section 199.—No owner shall allow any dog to bitch to run at large in the City unaccompanied by some person in charge thereof, the owner shall see that the same is securely housed between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Section 200.—The owner of dog or bitch who contravenes or fails to comply with the foregoing sections shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding five dollars.

Law and Order Will be Maintained.

Irish Provisional Government Issues Manifesto—U.S. Mine Workers Abandon Absolute Strike—Women Debarred from Methodist Ministry—A Characteristic German Offer.

GETTING TO WORK.

DUBLIN, June 27.
The Irish Provisional Government issued a manifesto this evening denouncing outrages against peace and security in Ireland, declaring the boycott of Belfast had no legal existence, and announcing that the Government would resolutely perform its duty to maintain law and order. The co-operation of citizens was invited.

ABSOLUTE STRIKE OF MINERS ABANDONED.

WILKESBARRE, Pa., June 27.
Upon receipt of a telegram from John Lewis, President of the United Mine Workers, who conferred with President Harding at Washington today, the General Scale Committee of the Anthracite workers abandoned all plans for immediate calling of an absolute strike and contemplated withdrawal of pickets from the mines.

CANADIAN PARLIAMENT PRO-ROGUE.

OTTAWA, June 28.
The Federal Parliament prorogued this morning.

DOMINION PARLIAMENT PLANS

OTTAWA, June 27.
Premier King announced in the House this afternoon that Parliament would meet again in January, that a redistribution bill will be brought down early next session and that there will be no general election in the interval.

AGAINST WOMEN FOR MINISTRY.

TORONTO, June 27.
The Quarterly Official Boards of the Methodist Church in Canada have voted by a comparatively small majority against the admission of women into the Ministry.

GOVERNMENT PLAN TO END COAL STRIKE.

WASHINGTON, June 27.
The Government proposes to apply a plan which is expected to end the coal miners' strike. It is understood the Courts will be asked to enjoin the United Miners from interfering with

the operation of coal miners and if necessary tie up the strike funds.

26 KILLED IN RAILWAY ACCIDENT.
BERLIN, June 27.
Twenty-six persons were killed and thirty seriously injured in a railway accident near here to-day.

INGENIOUS.

PARIS, June 27.
A huge war reparations plan, under which Germany would reconstruct devastated France and also build a tunnel under the English Channel, has been submitted by Minister of Public Works Trocquer to Premier Poincare. The plan involves the use of German material and labor to the extent of twenty billion francs.

TWENTY FOUR HOURS' STRIKE.

BERLIN, June 27.
As a demonstration against reactionary forces a twenty-four hour strike through Germany called by the Federation of Trade Unions commenced at noon to-day. Guests at hotels were warned to supply themselves with canned stuff.

MINERS' OUTRAGE.

BRIDGEPORT, Ohio, June 27.
One miner was killed and another wounded when fired on to-day while en route to work at Strip Mine at Uniontown. The victims were in an automobile when shots came from the hills.

STRIKE IN ITALY.

ROME, June 27.
The nation wide strike called by metal workers is fairly complete in Milan, Turin and Trieste, and in partial effect in Genoa, Naples and other places. The strike is a protest against employers cancelling in part the allowance for high cost of living. The Government is trying to arrange a settlement.

EIGHT KILLED IN EXPLOSION.

KNOXVILLE, June 27.
Eight men were killed and ten injured in an explosion this afternoon at the plant of Holston Quarry Company at Straw Plains, thirteen miles from here.

RAILWAY SHOPMEN THREATEN STRIKE.

CHICAGO, June 27.
A strike of 400,000 railway shopmen of the country will be called for July 1st, unless the railroads agree to stay the \$60,000,000 wage cut due the shop workers on that date and restore certain working conditions formerly in effect. It was made known to-night.

A BLOW AT THE REPUBLIC.

BERLIN, June 27.
The assassins who killed Dr. Walter Rathenau, Germany's Foreign Minister, were studying at the Republican movement of Germany and its people, declared President Ebert at Dr. Rathenau's funeral in the Reichstag Chamber to-day.

Scout Camp.

The Gower St. Troop of Boy Scouts will hold their fourth annual Camp this year at Manuels. The Camp ground has been changed, and is on a better site this year, nearer the station, and with a much better place for pitching tents. The advance party will go out on Saturday to make arrangements. The Camp will open July 3rd, and close on July 15th. An excursion to Bell Island has been arranged for the last week of camp. All former Scouts are allowed to go to camp this year as well as those now members of the Troop. About sixty have signed on to-day, and the Camp promises to be the biggest yet.
