According to the description given of this vast and magnient establishment, there are thirty-six furnaces for preparing horns and tortoise-shell for the combs, and no less than one hundred and twenty iron screw presses are continually performing the operation of stamping them.. Steam power is emare continually performing the operation of stamping them. Steam power is emplayed to cut the combs. The coarse combs are stamped or cut out, two being cut in one piece at a time. The fine dressing combs are cut by fine saws, some so fine as to cut forty teeth in the space of one inch, and revolving five thousand times in the space of one minute. There are some two thousand varities of combs made, and the aggregate number produced, of all these different kinds, is 8,000,000 annually, a quantity that, if laid together lengthwise, would extend about 700 miles. A hoof undergoes as many as eleven distinct mechanical and artistic operations before it becomes a finished comb. 
