1,320 HOURS IN A DAY

A London Professor Makes a Startling Prophecy.

London, May 23.—In the course of the time the length of the day will be prolonged to 55 present days, stated Prof. George H. Darwin, who gave the information in a lecture at the Royal Institution on the astronomical influence of tides.

He said that the day and month were both lengthening at relative rates, which were calculated through the absolute rates in time, but the day would be the equal of the month in the year of the rotation of the earth would proceed until the day was equal to 55 present days.

The moon was a time when the moon went round the earth in from three to five of our present hours. Obviously, the moon must then have been very close to the earth. In fact, would almost touch its surface.

THE NEEDS OF CHILDREN MINISTER BADLY INJURED

National Council of Women Deal With London Resolution.

Rev. W. W. Shepherd, of Muncey, Thrown From His Buggy.

Amendment Adopted Re Home Work Suffers From Shock and Is Not Expected to Recover.

Toronto, May 23.—The National Council of Women yesterday discussed a resolution of the London council against the excessive amount of home work required from most school children. Among those who took part were: Mrs. Barker, Miss Derrick, Mrs. Hodless, Miss Frithgibson, Mrs. Ballard, Mrs. Hughes, Mrs. Sharp, Miss Machar, Miss Calder and Dr. Guilen. Finally the following amendment was adopted unanimously: "That Mrs. Hoodless, Mrs. Anderson (P. E. I.), Miss Cameron (B. C.), Mrs. J. L. Hughes, Mrs. Skinner (N. E.), be appointed a committee to obtain expert opinion as to the amount of home work required of school children, and the adjustment of school curriculum to the needs of the children."

The report of the committee on domestic science was then given by Mrs. Hoodless, who spoke in glowing terms of the progress of this branch of education throughout the province.

The resolution proposed by the Montreal local council, "that the name of the standing committee on domestic science be changed so as to include manual training," was unanimously adopted.

Mrs. Hoodless, of Hamilton, and Miss Frithgibson gave addresses.
